Report of incident with Karl Pierson on December 11th, 2013:

Karl came to class and before the bell rang he asked to fill his water bottle. I told him to go quickly because we were starting the review for the final. The bell then rang and I started teaching. A couple of minutes later, Karl began pounding on the door very loudly and very fast. It scared me and the class. One of my students opened the door and he came in. I said "Karl, what are you doing?" and he yelled "You locked me out!" I said "no one locked you out but that pounding was very inappropriate. He continued saying "I was locked out!" very angrily. I said "Are you serious, Karl?" I was shocked at how angry he was. He screamed at me "as a heart attack". At that point I said "get your things and leave my class. You may not talk to me like that". He slammed his water bottle on the table and grabbed his backpack and left. I calmed the other students down and got them started on their work for about 2 minutes and then went in the hallway to talk to Karl about his outburst. My heart was racing. He was not in the hallway. I immediately went to the world language office and called 6000 and told Paula Lewis that I needed an administrator in C-20.

A few minutes later Kevin Kolasa came through my door. I stepped into the hallway and told him what had happened. He asked why I kicked him out of class and I told him that Karl scared me and the class and I felt he needed to be out of the classroom. He said he could tell the kids were scared by the way they acted when he walked in the room. He told me that he would talk to Karl. He was taking notes on his phone while I was talking.

Kevin Kolasa came back again during 6th hour and I again stepped out into the hallway to talk to him. He told me that he talked to Karl who admitted that he was out of control in my class and that he wanted to apologize. Kevin said that he told him not to come today and that he had sent him home. He said he would come and speak to me on Thursday (the next day) during 2nd period because we both had an off hour. He also told me that he had called Karl's mother and told her what had happened and that she wasn't very concerned because Karl hadn't cursed at me. I told Kevin again that he really scared me and the class and that I was concerned about his behavior. Kevin told me that he had decided not to suspend him and I agreed that I didn't feel it was a suspendable offense but that I thought I deserved an apology.

The following day, the 12th, Karl came to me at the end of 2nd period. He walked up to my desk and said he was apologizing for what happened yesterday. I can't remember his exact words. I told him that I accepted his apology and was glad he came to see me. I told him that he scared me and that he needed to control his anger. I think he said something like "I know". Then he turned around and left.
